
Message from Sister Cindy

Dear Parishioners,

I hope you will be able to join us at the parish reconciliation service this week. On Thursday evening, several priests will join and assist me in hearing the confessions of all who are present. We will begin at 7 PM with a brief prayer service and then the priests will be available for confessions until all are heard. Confessions will be heard both anonymously and face-to-face. No matter how long it has been since you last celebrated the sacrament, please know that you find a welcoming priest willing to help you receive Christ's forgiveness for your sins. Receiving that grace would be a great way to end the summer and begin the new academic year.

I had planned to give a thank you to the anonymous donor of the flowers for Masses last weekend. However, I found out who brought them and thanked them personally. Having said that, please know that fresh flowers for the church are always welcome (except maybe during Lent). One parishioner just brings a bundle from the store, leaves them in the sacristy, and has me arrange them (something I am happy to do), another periodically donates some extra money to the parish and asks me to buy some with that money, and now this formerly anonymous parishioner has brought some from his or her home already arranged. All of these possibilities are fine. If you are interested in beautifying our worship space in this way, just let me know.
