Dear SJS Parents,

Many thanks to the parents that have signed up for the Parent/Teacher Conferences. At this writing we are not at 100 % of the parents signed up. Please, if you have not signed up for a time to meet with your child's teachers, you need to go to FACTS and sign up for a time. We have always had a great turn out for this conference. Let's do it again this school year. Every parent needs to sign up for a time to meet with your child's teachers.

October is the beautiful month of all the different Feast days of the Saints. It is also the month that we begin our Rosary Box asking families to say a Rosary for an unborn baby or for a baby that you have known that is now in heaven.

Each class has a Rosary Box and directions are inside the box as to what to do. Once the Rosary is said, please write the name of the baby you prayed for on either the blue (for a boy) or a pink (for a girl) slip and return the Rosary box with the slips, Rosary pamphlet, and the new blue Rosary in the plastic bag label for your child's grade.
