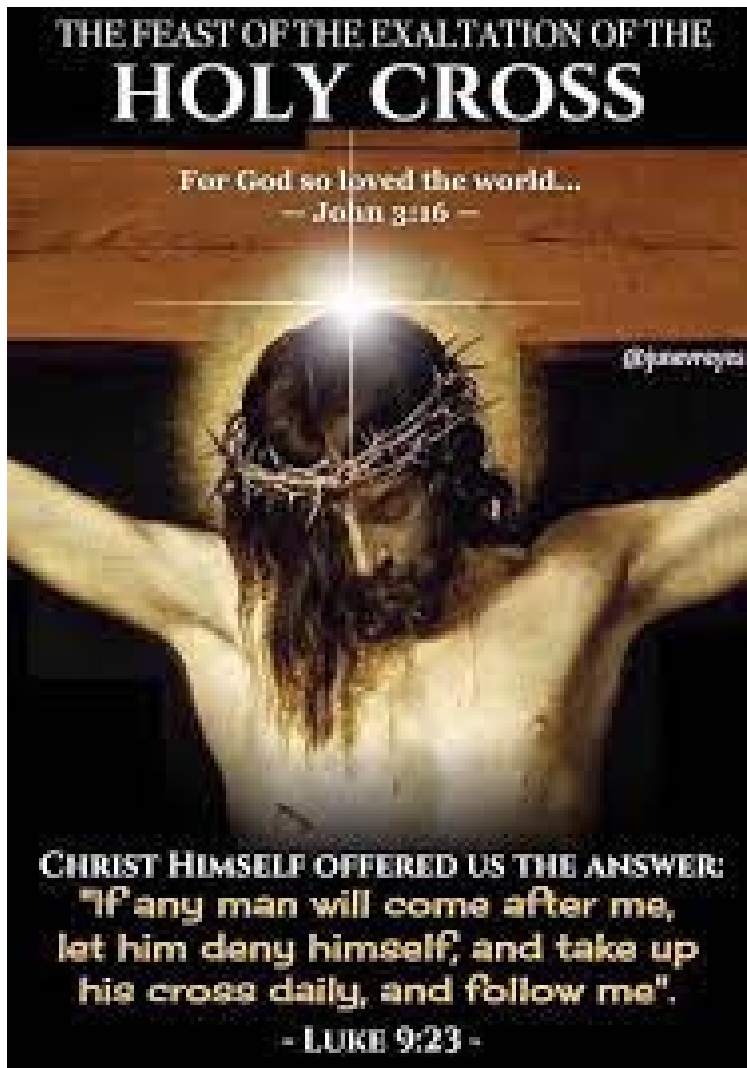

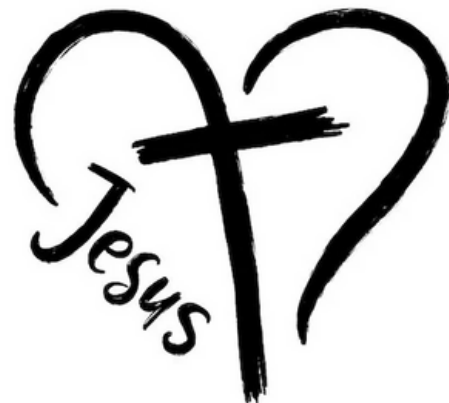

## MASS INTENTIONS

While each Mass is offered in a general way for the needs of all the world and for the souls of the faithful departed, the priest offering the Mass can apply the specific fruits of that Mass for an intention of his choice. By ancient tradition, members of the faithful may request the priest to offer Mass for a specific intention of theirs. The code of Canon Law states that "A priest is free to apply the Mass for anyone, living or dead." (can.901)

It is also customary, though not absolutely required, for the faithful to make a donation to express their concrete connection with the offering of that particular Mass. In former times, this donation was often the things physically necessary to offer Mass (bread, wine) or other things required for the support of the clergy. Today, such a donation (a "Mass offering") is usually a small cash donation. In the Diocese of Jefferson City, the customary donation for a single Mass is \$10. In our diocese, these donations are given to the parish.

If you wish Mass to be offered for a specific intention and to make a donation in connection with this intention, please place an envelope marked "Mass intention" in the collection basket.

## MANDATORY TRAINING FOR PRIESTS

On September 11/12, the Diocese is holding a mandatory training for priests on the maintenance of appropriate boundaries. This will not affect our Mass schedule, but Fr. Schrader will be attending this training with all priests of the diocese on these days.

## ADULT FAITH FORMATION: "APPARITIONS, VISIONS, & PRIVATE REVELATIONS?" - SEPTEMBER 13

Adults and older high-school students are invited Sep. 13 for adult faith formation. Fr. Schrader will discuss what the Catholic Church teaches about apparitions, visions, and private revelations. Do Catholics have to believe in the events and messages of Lourdes, Fatima, etc.? What about other claims that Christ, Mary, or the saints have visited and spoken with people?

At the deanery meeting of August 22, it was reported to the Southeast Deanery that Bishop McKnight is still reviewing submitted proposals for the Shaping Our Future Together process. There is no further word from the diocese at this time. The Bishop did say: "You have my blessing to move forward with your proposal even without formal approval from me. I would like to make some suggestions but am not ready to do that at present. I would like the benefit of other deanery submissions, if not all of them together, before responding formally."
